
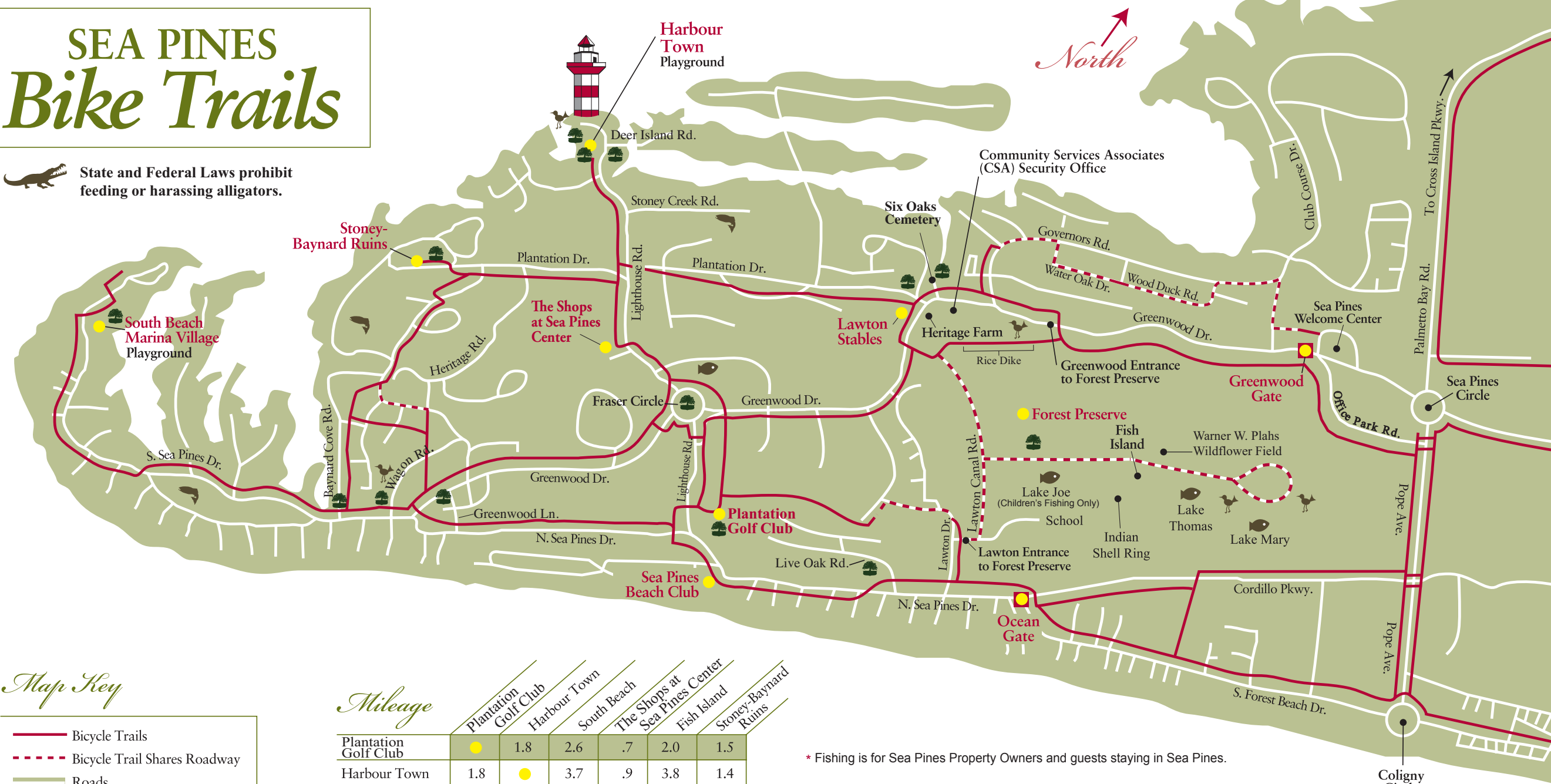


SEA PINES Bike Trails






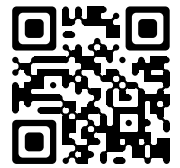

* Anyone fishing from shore in the ocean or any other navigable body of salt/brackish water within Sea Pines must also have a South Carolina saltwater fishing license.

POINTS OF INTEREST

- **Forest Preserve:** Hiking, fishing, picnicking, and wildlife viewing opportunities abound in the 605 acre Forest Preserve. The Warner W. Plaahs Wildflower Field is a “must see” in spring. Be sure to visit the 4,000 year old Indian Shell Ring (listed on the National Register of Historic Places), and enjoy a scenic bike ride down the rice dike. *Bicycles are not permitted on the nature trails, so please park your bicycles at the locations provided.*
- **Harbour Town:** One-of-a-kind boutiques and galleries, waterfront restaurants, cafès and lounges, great live entertainment including Gregg Russell's seasonal family concerts, boating and water sports. Enjoy the view from atop the landmark candy-striped lighthouse.
- **Lawton Stables:** Discover the scenic Forest Preserve on horseback. Guided tours are available and depart daily. Treat your children to a pony ride or the petting farm. Open 7 days a week.
- **Sea Pines Beach Club:** The Sea Pines Beach Club offers indoor and outdoor dining with beautiful views of the Atlantic Ocean. Visitors can also enjoy seasonal live entertainment.
- **The Shops at Sea Pines Center:** Top quality jewelry, men's and women's clothing, accessories, antiques, books, full service spa and bike rental. Visit one of several excellent restaurants and the only gas station, fitness center and post office in Sea Pines.

- **Plantation Golf Club:** The elegant clubhouse serves the Heron Point and Atlantic Dunes golf courses and offers a premier event, golf, and dining experience. Live Oak, located in the Plantation Golf Club, showcases Lowcountry-inspired cuisine and locally sourced produce and products. Boasting a 35-foot rotunda ceiling and floor-to-ceiling windows that provide an incredible 270-degree golf view, the restaurant offers indoor and outdoor seating options.
- **South Beach Marina Village:** Plenty of fun and entertainment for the whole family and the home of The Salty Dog. A unique collection of shops and restaurants nestled in a New England style fishing village overlooking beautiful Braddock Cove.
- **Stoney-Baynard Ruins:** Enjoy a self-guided walk of the ruins of an antebellum plantation. The site is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is the only tabby ruins of a main plantation house on Hilton Head Island.

DID YOU KNOW?

Hurricane Matthew impacted Hilton Head Island during the early morning hours of Saturday, October 8th, 2016. Matthew was the first hurricane to make landfall north of Florida during the month of October since Hurricane Hazel in 1954.

Many thousands of trees fell in Sea Pines and few properties were unaffected. Almost 450,000 cubic yards of storm debris were removed from the community!

The entire Sea Pines community worked diligently on cleanup efforts. While few obvious signs of damage remain today, memories of Hurricane Matthew will persist for years to come.

Rules of the Road

The bicycle paths in Sea Pines are shared by joggers, rollerbladers, and walkers. To ensure that everyone enjoys our paths, here are a few helpful tips.

- Stay in single file on the right side of the path.
- Use of roadway, where bike path exists, is prohibited.
- Be aware of vehicles, **they are not required to stop for bikes.**
- Be considerate of pedestrians and warn them of your approach at least 50' away.
- Safety equipment such as helmets and horns/bells are recommended for bikers; helmets and kneepads for rollerbladers.
- Obey all state and local traffic laws, including the use of hand signals and observance of traffic signs.
- Guests who leave Sea Pines must obtain a pass code reflected at the gate exits to gain re-admittance to the bicycle paths.
- Please refrain from riding on golf cart paths.
- Racing or high-speed operations of bikes or rollerblades is prohibited.
- Night biking is dangerous and is not permitted in Sea Pines.
- Vehicles should never stop and wave a cyclist on. This will, and does, cause accidents in Sea Pines.
- Use of paths in Sea Pines is limited to residents and guests.
